Children's Art Show/Silent Auction Entry Criteria



The Child Development Department at Connors State College is seeking original children's artwork to celebrate Connors State College Centennial and the Week of the Young Child (WOYC). The theme for the artwork should reflect Connors Centennial or Celebrating Children. Original artwork is defined as being authentic original works, creative, and using unstructured materials and techniques.

For example, this could be as simple as scribbled or finger-painting art to a more complex drawing by an older child. Examples of media include: crayon, chalk, paint, pencil, collage, natural materials, etc. Selected artwork will be available for purchase at a Silent Auction to be held in April. Our goal is to raise \$1,908 for the CSC Early Childhood Foundation Fund for educational purposes.



Awards and prizes will be given in each age group based on creativity and originality: Each winner receives an art supply basket valued at \$25

-  **Monet in the Making:** ages: 2-7
-  **Potential Picasso:** ages 8-11
-  **Budding Rembrandt:** ages 12-18

Also, awards will be given for the following:

-  **Centennial Brush Award**(Best in Show)
-  **Color My World Award** (Artwork that raises the most money)

Winners to be determined during the silent auction and will receive the following prizes:

-  The **Centennial Brush Award** winner will receive a gift certificate valued at \$50.
-  The **Color My World Award** winner will receive a signed and numbered original Tiger print donated by CSC's Phi Theta Kappa

Gather your supplies - the deadline is March 7, 2008.

Posters will be selected on the following criteria for Auction & Show:

- meet the required poster size of 8x10 or 9x12 inches and must be on art quality paper
- portrays the theme, "Connors Centennial or Celebrating Children"

On a 3x5 index card write the following information and paper clip to the poster: child's first name, child's age, title of artwork, submitted by, submitter's contact information. Posters must be turned in no later than noon in Muskogee to Mrs. Cowan in office 206D, Kim Phillips, office 206B or Mr. Stan Cowan's office on the Warner Campus CLB, 3rd floor on March 7th.
